

Cynthia Izuno Macri

Dr. Cynthia Macri was commissioned into the U.S. Navy in 1979 and retired as a Captain after 35 years of service as a gynecologic oncologist. She held a variety of academic and executive leadership roles at the National Naval Medical Center, Naval Hospital Jacksonville, FL, Walter Reed Army Medical Center (Washington, DC), the Naval Medical Education and Training Command, and the Uniformed Services University before moving to the Pentagon to serve as Special Assistant to the Chief of Naval Operations for Diversity. Upon retirement in 2013, she was retained on active duty for an additional 12 months to serve as Chief Strategist for the 21st Century Sailor Office where she advised the Chief of Naval Personnel on human performance, unit cohesiveness, personnel readiness and productivity and the Navy's effort to combat sexual assault/sexual harassment, suicide and mental health as well as destructive behaviors such as underage and binge drinking, drinking and driving, fraternization, and bias in evaluations and promotions.
